Ensemble Students: Who can sing, act and pick up basic choreography. These students will be featured in numbers including: Opening, Jolly Holiday, Supercal, Let's Go Fly a Kite, Anything Can Happen

<u> Major Roles:</u>

Jane (actor should be able to play an 11 year old) She is high spirited, bright and precocious but can be willful and inclined to snobbishness. The daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Banks.

Child soprano

Vocal Range:

Michael: (actor should be able to play a 9 year old) He is cute and cheeky, excitable and a little naughty. He adores his father and tries to be like him. Both he and Jane Misbehave in order to get attention from their parents. Male child voice (unbroken)

*Will be asked to read the Jane and Michael dialogue with a Mary Poppins from DHS (if students want to audition for Michael or Jane, they must have their lines memorized.)

- *Will be asked to sing the attached music for Jane (girls) and Michael (boys)
- *Will be taught basic choreography just to see if they are able to pick up basic steps (Step touch, Jazz Square, 3 count turns, arm movements)
- *Must bring (Your Check List)
 - A printed current photo
 - The audition permission form (completed)
 - Knowing the Actor Form (completed) 🥽

Student SHOW Requirements:

Mandatory Dates: MUST attend the tech and dress rehearsals along with attending each performance.

Tech Rehearsal: Jan. 19-29 Mon-Fri

Dress Rehearsal: Feb. 1-3, 8-9

Show Dates: Feb 4-6, 11-13

**Please make sure your student is available for those dates prior to auditioning.

Saturday Rehearsals:

DANCE 9am-5pm

These are tentative dates and will not require the whole cast, however they should be considered mandatory in order to be in the dance number (on student's schedule-given 1st week of rehearsal)

Jan. 9, 16, 23, 30

* If choreography is missed, students will not be part of the dance number unless decided by Mrs. Schmidt. **Rehearsals:** Attendance has been hurting our shows in the past productions. For this musical, attendance will be vital to a good show. Poor attendance will not be accepted. Students will need to attend every rehearsal they are called for or provide reason why rehearsal is missed. Work and homework are not valid excuses to miss a rehearsal. Students will be given 3 EXCUSED absences for rehearsals, however, no absences will be allowed during tech and dress rehearsals, for any reason other than a complete emergency. Doctor/dentist/tutor appointments should always be scheduled outside of rehearsal times. Rehearsals will be weekdays, the schedule varies but usual rehearsal times are 2:30-5:30 or 5:30-8:30pm a TENTATIVE schedule will be given to students during the first week of rehearsals (we understand that many younger students are unable to make it directly after school- this will be accommodated). Remember, you must notify Mrs. Schmidt, in writing, via email, 24 hours PRIOR to missing a rehearsal for any reason. Missing a rehearsal hurts the whole cast. Directors and teachers need to be informed of any absences in advance so they can plan accordingly including if you are sick from school. If you will not be able to meet the time requirements, you will not be considered for a lead, supporting or dance role.

Parent Involvement:

Mandatory Parent Meeting: Monday, Nov. 2 at 6pm in choir room.

<u>One Volunteer:</u> Students are required to have one adult volunteer for you to help with our many requirements and production needs. This will be followed strictly this year as Poppins is a HUGE show and we can't do it without you!

Elementary and Middle School Parents: In addition to the above information, we will need you in the following ways:

For ALL Elementary and Middle School students:

They must bring their own snack to each rehearsal.

For parents with students between the ages of 5-10:

Rehearsals: For each rehearsal the 5-10 year olds attend, Mrs. Wygocki will be the coordinator for the rehearsal. She will set up at least ONE parent volunteer to be at the 5-10 year old rehearsal to help monitor, guide and manage these students. Our high school students will also be there to monitor and watch specific students through rehearsals but at times, our high school students will not be able to monitor them. For safety purposes, we need your help volunteering with this! © Thank you, in advance, for your understanding. Parents, if you choose to do so, you may stay at rehearsal the entire time, as long as it does not interfere with the rehearsal.

Performances: One parent or guardian at each performance (either backstage or in audience).

<u>Casting</u>: Casting is done with what is **best** for the SHOW. Though we love all of our students and care about them all individually, we cannot cast for individual student's (or parent's) desires. We are looking for the BEST for each role. For the **best** casting outcome, students must come to auditions overly prepared with positive behavior. Priority will be given to those with siblings or relatives in the program along with CVS district students, and CVS staff's students, however, if an out of district student is BEST for the role, they will be asked to play the particular role.

Financial Obligations: Elementary and Middle School




